Notes from our Nurses

Although there has been a lot of news lately regarding the Ebola Virus, Enterovirus D68 or EV-D68 has been much more common and problematic. EV-D68 is a non-polio enterovirus that can cause mild to severe respiratory illness. Although there have been reports of EV-D68 every year, this year the number of reported cases has been much higher than in previous years. Almost all of the confirmed cases have been among children,

many of whom had asthma or a history of wheezing.

Symptoms can range from mild to severe and can include fever, runny nose, sneezing, cough, body and muscle aches to wheezing and difficulty breathing especially in children with a history of asthma. The virus is found in respiratory secretions and is spread when an infected person coughs sneezes or touches a surface that is then touched by others. Parents and care providers should seek medical attention immediately for children who are having any difficulty breathing (wheezing, difficulty speaking or eating, blueness around the lips), particularly if the child suffers from asthma. There is no specific treatment for EV-D68 nor is there a vaccine to prevent it.

The best way to prevent transmission of enteroviruses is to:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid kissing, hugging and sharing cups or eating utensils with people who are sick
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or shirt sleeve, not your hands
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces, such as toys and doorknobs, especially if someone is sick

Supporting Children during the Holidays

The holidays can be a challenging time for children who are separated from their families. While the care you provide them is critical in helping them heal, the holidays can serve as a reminder for the losses the child has suffered. Here are some tips to support you in helping the child maintain ties to his birth family:

- *Invite* the child to pick a special side dish for holiday meals that may represent something he had as part of his celebrations with his birth family.
- Work with your child's social worker to connect with the birth family about having a gift or card from them during gift giving celebrations.
- Ask children about customs or rituals they would like to observe in your home.
- Share holiday photos of the child with birth families.
- Bake holiday cookies or other goodies for the child to take to visits with family members.
- Allow for extra phone calls and letter writing between children and their families.
- Ask your child if they would like to get her family members a gift and encourage homemade gifts from the child.



Foster Youth School Enrollment

When enrolling a foster child in school, please remember to let the registrar know that you are enrolling a foster child. Schools are offered additional funds when they serve foster youth and informing the school you are caring for a child in the foster care system will allow schools to better meet the needs of foster youth in the educational setting. We love to spread the word about the amazing care our foster and relative caregivers offer to children during extremely difficult times. Social Worker Melyssa Markloff recently shared this story about a foster family she has been working with:

[[These foster parents] have been absolutely fantastic. They currently have placement of one of my clients and we are moving forward with a recommendation of adoption for them. However, in recent weeks Family Finding located [relatives] who are interested in a relationship with the child. [This family has] been open to having those relationships and have actually put the family at ease! [The family is] even working with the [relative] to have a "meet and greet" where he will meet his [the child] for the first time. The [foster family has] gone above and beyond to have familial connections for this child. I am so happy I was able to work with them and hope we can have more positive experiences like this one. I am truly blown away by their commitment to this child and their complete dedication to permanency while not cutting off any biological connections.

TaxTime

As a foster or relative caregiver, you are eligible to claim the children in your care on your income taxes if they have been with your for at least 6 months and 1 day. You will be asked to sign an acknowledgment that you are receiving confidential information that will only be used for income tax purposes. Please remember that the RDS team members are not tax experts and cannot offer consultation or support in answering tax related questions. Utility Assistance

Did you know that you might be eligible for a lower rate on your gas and electric bill through the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) and Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) programs? If you or someone in your home is benefiting from the following programs you may be eligible: Medi-Cal / Medicaid, Women, Infants and Children (WIC), CalWORKs (TANF) or Tribal TANF, CalFresh (Food Stamps), National School Lunch Program (NSLP), or Supplemental Security Income (SSI). Families may receive up to 20% off their gas bills through So Cal Gas and up to 30% off your Edison bill! Home owner and renters that receive utility bills through their landlords are eligible. Welcome Back Team Decision Making/Family Meetings!

We are excited to bring back Team Decision Making (TDM)/ Family Meetings to Ventura County, as part of our commitment to the Quality Parenting Initiative. The purpose is to bring together families, caregivers, service providers and Children and Family Services Staff (CFS) to work as a team to come to an agreement on the placement of the child and/ or to make a Safety/Action Plan to protect the child and preserve or reunify the family. TDM/Family Meetings offer all parties connected with the child(children) to come together to participate in the decision making process and function as a critical partnership of care.

TDM/Family Meetings are based on the belief that children need a family, families need strong nurturing communities, and Children and Family Services can best help families by partnering with their communities.

Over the next couple of months, Children and Family Services staff and community partners will be providing training to Caregivers, CFS staff and service providers on the benefits of TDM/family meetings. Kinship Parenting for Relative Care Givers (Walk-ins welcome!)

In the Month of August:A total of 1,242 cases were open with CFS.36 new cases were referred and 35 cases were closed.320 children were in foster care placements.110 children remained in group homes or at Casa Pacifica.353 children were in kinship/relative care placements.We welcomed 3 new foster homes into the CFS family!
