Respite Care Program Updates

We know that caregivers need time to take a break and recharge their batteries! Beginning in July there will be a few changes to the program that will enable us to continue to meet the growing need for respite care. *Please note: Availability is subject to change based upon our funding limitations during the fiscal year.*

Basic Eligibility:

County licensed foster parents, relative caregivers, and nonrelated extended family members of children ages 0-12 are automatically eligible to receive up to 12 hours/month of free respite care per month if they are providing care to a Ventura County CFS child. FFA foster parents, including ITFC homes, are able to receive up to 6 hours/month of free respite care. All caregivers are always welcome to work with their assigned respite care provider and pay them privately for additional hours.

Exceptions to Basic Eligibility:

Exceptions for more than 12 hours of care per month may be granted on a case by case basis. Exceptions will be approved on a quarterly basis, and will need to be authorized each quarter. Exception request of more than 20 hours per month will require manager approval. Exceptions for more than two consecutive quarters will be considered on limited basis. FFA homes are not eligible for exceptions.

Priorities for exceptions to the basic respite program are as follows:

- 1. Caregivers caring for medically fragile children who are receiving services/intervention to meet medical needs.
- 2. Caregivers caring for children with significant behavioral, developmental, and/or mental health symptoms and are receiving services to address these needs.
- 3. Caregivers caring for sibling sets or who have multiple placements in the home.
- 4. Caregivers providing care for teens that are unable to be independent due to mental health, behavioral, and/or medical issues.

The Reasonable & Prudent Parent Standard

We know that as a licensed foster parent, you have many standards to meet and regulations to follow. The Foster VC Kids team is here to help you understand those rules. Babysitting is something that many caregivers have questions about. California, in its effort towards normalcy for foster children and the families that care for them, adopted the Reasonable & Prudent Parent Standard in 2006. This standard applies in specific situations when a caregiver arranges other care for a child or allows a child to participate in activities in our outside the home.

State Laws and Foster Family Home Regulations Allow:

 Foster Children are able to participate more freely in extracurricular, social and enrichment activities provided the care takes reasonable steps to determine the appropriateness of the activity given the child's age, maturity, and developmental level. These activities include sports, school-related activities, recreational activities, organized clubs/groups, sleepovers, visitors to the home, and use of computer and cell phone.

- Foster Caregivers are allowed to use occasional, short term baby-sitters (less than 24 hours of care) without requiring a background check, TB test, or CPR Training. Caregivers should share information about the child's emotional, behavioral, medical, or physical conditions and how to reach the caregiver with the babysitter.
- This does not apply to ongoing, predictable childcare needs. In those cases, babysitters are required to be background checked and the care needs to take place in the foster family home.
- For care provided in the foster family home for more than 24 hours, the babysitter must also be background checked.
- Care provided out of the home for more than 72 hours is considered a placement change and requires social worker approval.



Notes from Our Nurses: Water Safety Tips For Summer

Warm weather, longer days, shorter nights, and soaking up the sunshine at the beach or pool side is something many Ventura County residents are looking forward to. Unfortunately with summer coming, the incidence of child drowning increases. Understanding what to look for to prevent or reduce the risk of drowning and eliminating the misconception of what actual drowning looks like is critical to decrease these incidences. In many child drownings, adults are nearby but are unaware that the victim is in fact struggling. Drowning is almost always deceptively quiet. The waving, splashing, and yelling seen on television is rarely seen in real life. It is critical that you practice safe behaviors around any bodies of water.

Some tips include:

 Never use inflatable "water wings" or other devices, as they can deflate or pop and often leave caregivers with a false sense of security and the child with a false sense of his/her abilities in the water. Use only a coast guard approved life vests as support in the water, but don't rely on it for supervision of a child.

- Never swim alone or allow a child to be alone in a pool or other body of water. A water safe adult should always be present.
- 3. Always brief baby-sitters on the rules and water safety levels of children.
- 4. Don't leave chairs or other items of furniture where a child could use them to climb into a fenced pool area.
- 5. Don't think you'll hear a child who's in trouble in the water; child drowning is a silent death, with no splashing to alert anyone that the child is in trouble

Just In Time Training is Here!

As part of our Quality Parenting Initiative, Foster VC Kids is excited to announce the launch of the QPI California website and Just in Time Training! Visit **www.qpicalifornia.org** to learn more about the initiative. Just in Time training does exactly what the name says: it provides free online training just in time to meet your training needs. The QPI California team is working diligently to create training videos to add to the existing library, which already includes nearly 100 training videos.

These trainings are provided by subject matter experts and are recorded, edited, and uploaded for caregivers to watch at their convenience. Training topics range from health issues, behaviors, parenting, caring for teens, transitions, trauma, and partnering with birth families. Many of the trainings offer a quiz and will email you a certificate of completion that you can use for your annual training hour requirements. In the coming year, we hope to offer live, interactive webcast trainings that can join in person or from your home. Nearly all of these trainings are eligible to reach your annual 8 hours of in-service training requirement.

Effectively partnering with a birth family may allow you to continue to have a relationship with the child/ren you love so much.

As our agency continues to move closer and closer to our goal of foster and birth families parenting together, we want you to keep Josh and Jinell in mind. This was submitted by their social worker, Saraa Lee:

"I am writing to let you know that we have a set of outstanding foster parents that I would love to have recognized in some way. Josh and Jinell have fostered 3 children, I believe. They went from never having had any contact with a biological parent to not only being willing to contact the parents via telephone, but actually attending and being rich participants in a recent TDM (Team Decision Making meeting). They personally transport the child in their care to visits with parents and additional grandparent visits, in order for the child to have a smooth transition when being moved from their care to paternal grandmother's care. I have been very vocal about how important their actions have been, as the department is actively moving toward having more openness between parents and foster parents for the well being of our children. They were very hesitant, but on their own decided the level of interaction they wanted to have, and it is very high."

On behalf of the entire Foster VC Kids team, thank you Josh and Jinell and the many other foster parents we know are forming a strong working relationship with the parents of the children in their homes! *This embodies what Foster VC Kids is all about!*

Foster Care Snapshot: The Critical Need Continues...

In the Month of March:

A total of 1,155 cases were open with CFS. There were 37 removals and 30 closed cases. 300 children were in foster care placements (County, Small Family Home and FFA). 109 children remained in group homes or in shelter care. 353 children were in kinship/relative care placements. We welcomed 2 new foster homes into the CFS family!



Please help us spread the word about the need for quality foster homes! Remember, foster parents are eligible to receive an incentive of \$100 for referring a family once they complete the licensing process and an additional \$100 once a child is placed in the new foster family's home!
